GTech Printing Corp. opening new Lakeland facility

A new instant-ticket printing facility is expected to open next spring by GTech Printing Corp. that could have as many as 200 employees by 2013.

The 100,000-square-foot facility, when opened next year, will employ 100 people initially to produce approximately 11 billion instant tickets annually, and is not expected to replace the current Plant City location, which will be used as redundant operations.

The Plant City facility was part of [Creative Games International](#) before it was acquired by the Rhode Island company in February 2007.

Build out costs of the facility were not released, but company executives said GTech looks to invest more than \$45 million in the Lakeland area through the next five years.

GTech is a division of [GTech Corp.](#), which was bought out by [Lottomatica S.p.A.](#) of Italy in 2006. The company won Florida's lottery operations contract for a 10-year term beginning in 2005, after beating out 15-year operator [Automated Wagering International](#) through a state-sponsored bidding process, a contract said to be worth more than \$300 million.
